

Nagaland Urban Infrastructure Development Project (NUIDP)

The Nagaland Urban Infrastructure Development Project (NUIDP) is an Externally Aided Project (EAP), sanctioned by the Government of India and proposed for financing by the Asian Development Bank (ADB). The project will be implemented across eight district headquarters in Nagaland (Dimapur, Kohima, Chümoukedima, Mokokchung, Wokha, Mon, Tuensang, and Zunheboto) to address critical urban infrastructure deficits and improve the quality, resilience, and sustainability of urban services.

The investment is aimed at developing climate-resilient urban infrastructure, with a focus on improving water supply systems, urban roads and roadside drains, storm water drainage networks, and landslide protection measures. These interventions are intended to enhance urban mobility, strengthen resilience to climate change and natural hazards, reduce flooding and landslide risks, and ensure reliable delivery of essential urban services.

The project also places strong emphasis on strengthening urban governance and institutional capacity to ensure the long-term sustainability of investments.
